A. ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVES

Mark Ballard, CSEA President welcomed everyone back from summer break. It will be an exciting new year with new teachers and new administration.

Bill Olzman, WSCTA President welcomed all to a new school year. Mr. Olzman introduced new chief negotiator, Betsy Amirkhan. Mr. Thomas and Mr. Olzman are excited for the new school year, there are concerns with class size. Mr. Olzman reviewed that it is time to market El Molino High School and advertise the small class sizes.

B. PRINCIPALS

Matt Dunkle, El Molino Principal welcomed everyone back to the school year. Mr. Dunkle thanked Maintenance Director, Jennie Bruneman and crew for doing a fantastic job getting the school and grounds ready for the start of school. Mr. Dunkle reported there will be 7 new teachers on campus. Tomorrow evening at 5:30 p.m. is the freshman BBQ, with representatives from Sonoma State and the Santa Rosa Junior College to speak to students and families. Leslie Grassl and Rachel Lasek worked over the summer on Common Core. The FFA had a successful summer with great showings at the Sonoma County Fair. Athletes from El Molino have been training during the summer.

Kent Cromwell, Laguna Principal welcomed everyone back and is very excited for this year. Mr. Cromwell reported The Community Foundation gave a grant to Laguna High School to help assist with a crisis counselor on the campus. Mr. Cromwell reported the Restorative

Resources program will be piloted at Laguna. The ropes course will be brought back to Laguna this year. Staff development money has been set aside at Laguna for work with at risk students. The garden is a great success. Laguna has a new website when you have a moment please take a look at the upgrades. Laguna will be building a rain catchment system with the help of a grant from the Community Foundation.

Chris Heller, Analy Principal reported Analy has new staff members with 6 new teachers. The custodial and maintenance staff has had a tremendous turnover this summer. Mr. Heller thanked Director of Maintenance, Jennie Bruneman and staff for getting the campus ready for the start of school. Mr. Heller thanked the Analy Alumni for a successful campus clean up day. Registration welcomed 324 freshmen yesterday, and thanked the Ag Boosters for the hot dog lunch. Mr. Heller reported he is excited to hear the presentation from speaker, Thomas Armstrong who will be the guest speaker at the District Inservice Day. Mr. Heller welcomed new principal, Matt Dunkle.

C. BOARD MEMBERS

Trustee DeSart – No report

Trustee Walker reported he had a busy, fun summer. He welcomed everyone back to the school year. He attended Performing Arts Center meetings and various field project meetings.

Trustee Landry reported she attended the Performing Arts Center meetings over the summer and it looks like El Molino's Performing Arts Center is making progress.

Trustee Twitchell reported Susan Kinder of Restorative Resources contacted her and there may be a possibility of some additional funding for a district wide system in West County. Trustee Twitchell will update on the progress.

Trustee Noe welcomed everyone back and is excited about the energy in the room and is positive about the upcoming year. District projects are moving forward. Trustee Noe is excited to run for the board seat and serving the West County for the next four years. Trustee Noe reported today is her wedding anniversary, she thanked her family and she appreciates her husband's support of her very busy schedule.

D. SUPERINTENDENT

- Superintendent's goals for 2014-2015 (attachment) – Mr. McDonald reviewed the goals for 2014-2015.
- Marketing and Outreach project update – Mr. McDonald reported on the progress and partnership for Marketing and Outreach with the Russian River RaRa, in hiring Jacob Rich. Jacob graduated from El Molino in 1997. Trustee Twitchell reported that Jacob will have an office here at El Molino High School, much of his time will be devoted to El Molino.
- Measure I facility improvement projects (Analy band room and stadium; El Molino irrigation, stadium and performing arts center) – Mr. McDonald reported the Architects for the El Molino PAC met with the committee and explored what direction to go and shared concerns with the architect firm. The committee has decided to stay with QKA Architects. The committee and architects will work together on a design. The Analy band room project is moving ahead and the design will be sent to the state architect for approval. Mr. McDonald met with stadium committees to finalize and review stadiums, the committees will meet again on October 1 for the final design and they will be brought to the October 8 Board meeting.
- Summer maintenance, custodial and grounds report; including Air Care Plus energy saving program – Mr. McDonald reported the custodial crews spent 54 days of summer cleaning the schools, and it shows. The grounds men aided by a tree company help managed the tree work. 95 work requests were submitted in June and 85 have been completed. Summer construction update, there has been repairs to the Analy tennis courts, the El Molino irrigation project has been going on all summer, it will not be done by the start of school but soon after. Preventative maintenance on the boilers and fire alarms are tested and repaired. 3 grants have been landed for water filling stations

which was funded by a Department of Health services grant, and solar production is off the charts.

- Summer School (attachment) – Mr. McDonald thanked the summer school staff and Co-Principals, Dave Ashworth and Lindsey Apkarian and Summer School Secretary, Denise Fisher, everyone did a great job and summer school was very successful. A new aspect with West County middle schools was implemented by teacher, Shauna Ferdinandson. A Summer Jump Start Program for students with grade issues, behavioral or attendance problems was offered. The superintendents were very happy with the results and are anxious to have the program again.
- West Sonoma County Union High School District student bus pass exemptions –Mr. McDonald reviewed the student buss pass and cost exemptions for EL, Foster and Socially Economic Disadvantaged students.
- El Molino activity bus to start Monday, August 25 – will start up at 5:45p.m. The bus will run down to Monte Rio. It is hopeful this will encourage students to stay after school during week for extracurricular activities.
- Career Pathways Trust grant at Analy and El Molino (attachment) – Mr. McDonald reviewed the Northern California Career Pathways Alliance and the programs.
- Procedures for families using Caregiver option (attachment) – Mr. McDonald reported the Caregiver forms have been sent to the families using that option explaining the legal obligation and also the explanation of the serious nature of this option
- Late window transfer requests and enrollment for fall, 2014 (attachment) Mr. McDonald reviewed the updated late transfer requests.
- School Board positions in November - Mr. McDonald reported the filing for the positions closed last Friday at 5 pm but was extended because we had incumbents that have not filed. Looks like the District will have an election in November; we have not received an official notice from the Voter of Registrars office.
- The District will hold an Inservice Day on Monday, August 18 here at El Molino.

- Host family events at partner middle schools to provide information and support for future students in our District graduating from high school career and college ready

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- Collaborate with other agencies and organizations to focus additional community resources to support this goal. For example
 - Public libraries for adult literacy programs
 - SRJC for high school level and college level adult education classes
 - Community Clinics for health programs for students and families
 - Businesses and West County Community Services for youth employment
 - Health Action Chapters for community health

Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment

Implement curriculum, instruction and assessment aligned with the Common Core State Standards in grades K-12 across West Sonoma County

- Continue work from 2013-2014 to lead and support professional development and other efforts to coordinate a West County Grade 6-12 Common Core math program
- Lead and support professional development and other efforts to coordinate a West County Grade 6-12 Common Core English Language Arts program
- Plan, provide, measure, and evaluate professional development and other resources to increase use of technology to deliver effective instruction

Student Support

Using available resources, increase measures of student engagement (e.g. student attendance, credit accumulation and California Healthy Kids Survey)

- At Laguna High School, pilot a restorative justice approach, evaluate the program and determine next steps for the following school year
- Expand opportunities for leadership development and community involvement. For example
 - Tomorrow's Leaders Today
 - Health Action Councils
