

#4.DEC.2015-2016 IN THE MATTER OF DEVELOPER FEES

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Government Code Section 66006 imposes detailed requirements on public agencies which levy development fees. This section requires each district collecting developer fees to make an annual accounting of the fees available to the public by December 26, 20154. The annual accounting must then be reviewed by the governing board at its next regularly scheduled meeting, at least 15 days after the accounting was made available to the public.

The accounting disclosure and draft Resolution was initially made available for public viewing November 17, 2015 and also was made available via mailing upon request.

CURRENT CONSIDERATION:

As of June 30, 2015, the available Developer Fee fund balance was \$548,925. During the 2014-15 fiscal year, the District collected \$62,002 in mitigation fees and expended \$70,728 for bus facility payments and portable classroom additions/DSA certifications at Analy High School. In addition, during 2013-14, the District, with guidance obtained from consultation with School and College Legal Services, transferred expenses from the Measure I Bond Fund (Fund 21) to cover a match portion of all Bond Funded Facility Improvement Projects for prior years (2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13, and 2013/14) totaling \$254,970. The match portion for the 2014-15 fiscal year was \$40,437. The match portion for each Board approved bond funded facility improvement project is 3% annually and is based on unhoused student growth in the latest developer fee justification study. The District anticipates transferring 3% annually on all future projects will fully expend the developer fee fund balance and future estimated collections.

Attached, please find a Resolution Regarding Accounting of Development Fees, Resolution #4.DEC.2015-2016, related to statutory fees collected under Education Code Section 17620. The maximum amount allowed by the Stat of California for developer fee collection is \$3.36/square foot for residential space and \$0.54/square foot for commercial/industrial space. WSCUHSD shares its fees with our partner districts at a range of \$1.93 to \$3.36/square foot for residential construction and \$0.31 to \$0.54/square foot for commercial/industrial construction. There is no fee for residential construction less than 500 square feet.

WSCUHSD is currently collecting rates approved by Board resolution based on fees justified in a 1998 study conducted by Rob Corley of Ventura, California. In March 2010, WSCUHSD contracted with Government Financial Strategies of Sacramento, California to conduct a new justification study. Maximum rates allowed by law at that time were \$2.97 per square foot for residential construction and \$0.47 per square foot for commercial space. At that time, the WSCUHSD Board opted to keep collection rates equal to the 1998 study, declining to authorize a rate increase. In order to consider increasing fees, WSCUHSD would be required to contract for an updated justification study at an estimated cost of \$8,000. The new study would need to justify the collection of increased rates based on the current numbers of unhoused students and construction growth expected within the District's boundaries.

Attached, is the current developer fee breakdown for our elementary school and high school area.

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE WEST SONOMA COUNTY UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT REGARDING ACCOUNTING OF DEVELOPMENT FEES FOR 2014-15 FISCAL YEAR IN THE FOLLOWING FUND OR ACCOUNT: CAPITAL FACILITIES FUND (FUND 25) (Government Code sections 66001(d) & 66006(b))

RESOLUTION #4.DEC.2015-2016

1. Authority and Reasons for Adopting this Resolution.

A. This District has levied school facilities fees pursuant to various resolutions, the most recent of which is dated 11/12/2014, and is referred to herein as the "School Facilities Fee Resolution" and is hereby incorporated by reference into this Resolution. These resolutions were adopted under the authority of Education Code section 17620 (formerly Government Code section 53080). These fees have been deposited in the following fund or account:

CAPITAL FACILITIES FUND (FUND 25) (the "Fund");

- B. Government Code Sections 66001(d) and 66006(b) require this District to make an annual accounting of the Fund and to make additional findings every five years if there are any funds remaining in the Fund at the end of the prior fiscal year;
- C. Government Code Sections 66001(d) and 66006(b) further require that the annual accounting of the Fund and those findings be made available to the public no later than December 26, 2015, that this information be reviewed by this Board at its next regularly scheduled board meeting held no earlier than 15 days after they become available to the public, and that notice of the time and place of this meeting (as well as the address at which this information may be reviewed) be mailed at least 15 days prior to this meeting to anyone who has requested it.
- D. The Superintendent has informed this Board that a draft copy of this Resolution (along with Exhibits A and B which are hereby incorporated by reference into this Resolution) was made available to the public on November 17, 2015. The Superintendent has further informed this Board that notice of the time and place of this meeting (as well as the address at which this information may be reviewed) was mailed at least 15 days prior to this meeting to anyone who had requested it.
- E. The Superintendent has also informed this Board that there is no new information which would adversely affect the validity of any of the findings made by this Board in its School Facilities Fee Resolution.

2. What This Resolution Does.

This Resolution makes various findings and takes various actions regarding the Fund as required by and in accordance with Government Code Sections 66001(d) and 66006(b).

3. Findings Regarding the Fund.

Based on all findings and evidence contained in, referred to, or incorporated into this Resolution, as well as the evidence presented to this Board at this meeting, the Board finds each of the following with respect to the Fund for the 2014-15 Fiscal Year:

- A. In reference to Government Code Section 66006(b)(2), the information identified in section 1 above is correct;
- B. In further reference to Government Code Section 66006(b)(2), this Board has reviewed the annual accounting for the Fund as contained in Exhibit A and determined that it meets the requirements set forth in Government Code section 66006(b)(1);
- C. In reference to Government Code Section 66001(d)(1), and with respect only to that portion of the Fund remaining unexpended at the end of the 2014-15 Fiscal Year, the purpose of the fees is to finance the construction or reconstruction of school facilities necessary to reduce overcrowding caused by the development on which the fees were levied, which facilities are more specifically identified in Exhibit B;
- D. In reference to Government Code Section 66001(d)(2), and with respect only to that portion of the Fund remaining unexpended at the end of the 2014-15 Fiscal Year, the findings and evidence referenced above demonstrate that there is a reasonable relationship between the fees and the purpose for which it is charged;
- E. In reference to Government Code SSection 66001(d)(3), and with respect only to that portion of the Fund remaining unexpended at the end of the 2014-15 Fiscal Year, all of the sources and amounts of funding anticipated to complete financing in any incomplete improvements identified as the use to which the fees are to be put is identified in Exhibit B;
- F. In reference to Government Code Section 66001(d)(4), and with respect only to that portion of the Fund remaining unexpended at the end of the 2014-15 Fiscal Year, the approximate dates on which the funding referred to in paragraph e above is expected to be deposited into the appropriate account or fund is designated in Exhibit B; and
- G. In reference to the last sentence of Government Code Section 66006(d), because all of the findings required by that subdivision have been made in the fees that were levied in paragraphs c-f above, the District is not required to refund any moneys in the Fund as provided in Government Code section 66001(e).

4. Superintendent Authorized to Take Necessary and Appropriate Action.

The Board further directs and authorizes the Superintendent to take on its behalf such further action as may be necessary and appropriate to effectuate this Resolution.

5. Certificate of Resolution.

During 2013-14, the District, with guidance obtained from consultation with School and College Legal Services, transferred expenses from the Measure I Bond Fund (Fund 21) to cover a match portion of all Bond Funded Facility Improvement Projects for prior years (2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13, and 2013/14) totaling \$254,970. The match portion for the 2014-15 fiscal year was \$40,437. The match portion for each Board approved bond funded facility improvement project is 3% annually and is based on unhoused student growth in the latest developer fee justification study. The District anticipates transferring 3% annually on all future projects will fully expend the developer fee fund balance and future estimated collections.
