A. STUDENT BOARD REPRESENTATIVES

Analy fall sports update, the girls golf won the SCL, volleyball is hosting the SCL, Varsity football is 7-0, and this Saturday is the Apple Game which will be played at Rancho Cotate High School.

C. PRINCIPALS

Chris Heller, Analy Principal reported the Analy outreach process has begun. This past Monday Mr. Heller visited 3 middle feeder schools, to speak with parents and offered student shadow and tours. Student shadowing has begun. Parent tours are scheduled for 3 dates in November. This past Saturday night Mr. Heller attended the Analy Hall of Fame event which was highlighted by Chip Castleberry who was recognized for a Lifetime Achievement Award. Mr. Heller commended the committee; there was a lot of work that went into event. The counseling department has been very active with the college information night. This past October 12 Staff Development Day was very productive. Last Thursday the Analy Fall Choir Concert took place, the proceeds were sent to Middletown schools. The fall performance is, You Can't Take It With You. Mr. Heller reported the fall sports are wrapping up successfully; the girl's golf team is the Sonoma County league champions, the volley ball team is currently in first place, and varsity football is going great. Mr. Heller reported he is proud of coaches and the assistant coaches. Mr. Heller is looking forward to the Apple Game. 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The show will air November 1. Mr. Dunkle reported he is proud of the community which raised over 40 thousand dollars. November 5th is El Molino Night. Mr. Dunkle reported 5 students attended the Los Cien function at Sonoma State; the students came away from the conference with great enthusiasm. Mr. Dunkle acknowledges two teachers, Kate Aldridge and Keith Baker. These two new teachers have been doing great work along with extracurricular work such as; after school tutoring, SAT workshops and Safe School Ambassadors. The El Molino and Analy Safe Schools Ambassadors will be bringing their ideas together at the Center for the Arts. TLT will hold another session next week. Mr. Dunkle reported the girl's tennis team has done a great job this year and acknowledged Coach Monte who does a great job with the girls as well. Next week will be their last final match, Mr. Dunkle invited all to come out and support the tennis team.

E. SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Kellner reported on the Sonoma County Office of Education issue of Spotlight on Sonoma County. The issue features teachers from Sonoma County. The article from SCOE, regarding the beginnings of a teacher shortage nationwide and in Sonoma County is very informative. A very interesting article points out a typical student has 42 teachers in a span of their school life. With this information in mind our district needs to keep attracting great teachers to West County.

West County Transportation Agency welcomed a new member, Santa Rosa City Schools. SRCS has joined our JPA with a saving of 500 thousand to our district. This will start next school year.

- Continue to lead and support professional development and other efforts to coordinate a West County Grade 6-12 California Standards math program
- With significant input from all stakeholders, evaluate and consider increasing District math graduation requirement to 3 years (30 credits) of math from 2 years (20 credits)
- Lead and support professional development and other efforts to coordinate a West County Grade 6-12 California Standards English Language Arts program
- Plan, provide, measure, and evaluate professional development and other resources to increase use of technology in the District to deliver effective instruction

Student Support

Using available resources, increase student engagement as measured by student attendance and California Healthy Kids Survey

- Through “Keeping Kids in School (KKIS)” case management at Laguna High School, decrease Laguna truancy as reported in KKIS annual evaluation
- Maintain or increase school and community protective factors (e.g. caring relationships, high expectations and opportunities for meaningful participation), as measured by the California Healthy Kids Survey “School Connectedness Scale”
- Provide at least three new additional opportunities for student leadership development and community involvement (for example, Tomorrow’s Leaders Today, Project 1-4-1, Friday Night Live clubs, Health Action Councils)

Facilities

Continue to achieve Measure I Facility Improvement projects

- Complete Analy Band Room, Analy Stadium and El Molino Stadium projects
- Increase funding for District Deferred Maintenance plan
