- H. THE BOARD OF EDUCATION BUDGET ADVISORY SCHEDULE AND UPDATE – Dr. Kellner reviewed that the committee has met twice since the August Board meeting, with many in attendance. Dr. Kellner thanked the community, employees, Trustee Stecher and Trustee Bruhner for attending. The input from these meetings is valuable, we will have four more meetings and we hope to hear from many more including students. The following comments were made regarding:
- Trustee Stecher reported he was able to attend the first meeting so far and was pleasantly surprised by the participation of the stakeholders
 - Trustee Bruhner reported she was very pleasantly surprised with the engagement and commitment from the stakeholders. Everyone was interested and the group feels included. Trustee Bruhner encourages others to attend
 - Thank you for all the work that has been put into the process

 - Four more scheduled meetings and at the November 15 options will be presented to the Board

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- I. REPORT ON ENROLLMENT AND INTERDISTRICT AND INTRADISTRICT TRANSFERS FOR FALL 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR – Dr. Steven Kellner reported on the interdistrict and intradistrict transfers for the 2017-18 school year. We know that the LCFF is based on student enrollment, we also know in Sonoma County folks can attend any public school they choose and over the course of any school year enrollment declines. Overall worthy of note interdistrict transfers returning number of incoming 9th roughly the same returning 10 and 12 lower than in years past, this could be a result of the transfer student not living up to the terms of the agreement, the other piece is the students that left the district overall. There are students that have moved out of state, withdrew and attended an online school or independent study programs. The following discussion took place regarding:
 - People search for education that satisfies them
 - Can we figure out a way to track people that are leaving and are leaving public education because they are not satisfied? Yes, if folks move out of state, may never know if it is for a private or charter
 - Overall specific to the Outreach position that was at El Molino
 - How will we replace some of the work that position did? Would like to see that as an agenda item for the future. Now need to spend some time with outreach at Analy
 - Ninth grade transfers not necessarily see a drop
 - Compared to recent years
 - Online education, look at this down the road
 - Potential to bring in some students
 - What is the test on a designed online curriculum with the state?
 - Marketing in the community, committees at the school, some of the outreach has been refreshed and updated the web sites and updated brochures for the schools, and a district face book page is up and running
 - Independent Study at El Molino and online at El Molino
 - Can we track students that returned to us from online programs?
 - Mary Fricker, community member thanked the Board and the Administration for the work done on the intradistrict transfer policies and procedures
- J. LOCAL CONTROL ACCOUNTABILITY PLAN (LCAP) UPDATE – Dr. Steve Charbonneau gave an overview of the Local Control Accountability Plan Update. The following items were discussed:
 - Reviewed the LCAP, posted on web site in English and Spanish
 - Previous years data onto the info graphic and the difficulty
 - The Board thanked Steve Charbonneau for his work on the LCAP
